Bob turned out to be a very fine lead bowler for the ESL, and other club teams. He organised a 'Dads Army Academy' for mature(!) enthusiasts,

where in spite of being urged to 'fire', would always somehow manage to 'draw' right through the pack onto the jack.

Over the years he won a number of 'pots' both on the green and short mat. Although very competitive, importantly, he was always gracious, both in victory and defeat.
